Adverbs - Michigan State University - Many adverbs are formed by adding “ly to an adjective. Sometimes the spelling changes when the “ly is added. When an adjective ends in “ly, it usually has no adverb form. To use the word as an adverb, use the adjective in an adverb phrase. Examples of Rule #1: Adverbs - Ashford University -
